
# The Story of the CtK Food Forest

## What is a Food Forest?

A food production system modelled after a woodland ecosystem

- one of the most productive systems known
- one of the most sustainable systems known



#### The CtK Food Forest is Unique

- all plants are native to the United States
- or culturally significant to Native Americans

How did we do it?



The CtK Food forest was first proposed during the Winter 2021 online classes at the Cincinnati Permaculture Institute

(During COVID lockdown)

It was given the green light by the church shortly afterward.

#### Acquired 12 baby trees (several free) 2 berry bushes 1 roll of welded wire fence



We located contour lines 28 Oct 2021



We rented a sod-cutter 30 Oct 2021



Advertised a PermaBlitz



#### November 2021

All together we had 21 volunteers involved



### Flipped the sod



Moved the last row of sod to the front row, creating a shallow swale and a small berm.



We planted and caged the trees



Laid down cardboard

Covered it with leaf mulch and wood chips




#### Acquired Hundreds of Guild Plants

Majority grown from seed using the winter sowing method
